COMMISSIONERS' MEETING July 31, 2023

The Bartholomew County Commissioners met on July 31, 2023 in the Commissioners Chambers of the Governmental Office Building, 440 Third Street, Columbus, Indiana. Commissioners Larry S. Kleinhenz and Carl H. Lienhoop, County Auditor Pia O'Connor, Attorney Grant Tucker and County Administrator Tina Douglas were in attendance. Commissioner London was unable to attend.

Commissioner Kleinhenz opened the meeting, gave the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Lienhoop offered condolences on behalf of the county for the sudden loss of Director Mark Case, who had recently retired from the Animal Control Office. Officially, the new Director of Animal Control, Dean Satterfield, will begin today, July 31, 2023. In light of these circumstances, the Commissioners have decided to postpone an official introduction at this time.

The first item was the Approval of Minutes from July 24, 2023. Commissioner Kleinhenz motioned to Approve Minutes from July 24, 2023, as presented. Commissioner Lienhoop seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

The next item was the Approval of Claims. Commissioner Kleinhenz motioned to Approve Claims as presented. Commissioner Lienhoop seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next item was the weekly permits report as read by Commissioner Lienhoop:

The next item was the Consideration of a Memorandum of Understanding between Columbus Regional Hospital Foundation, Inc., Columbus Regional Hospital Healthy Communities Department and the Bartholomew County Public Health Department, presented by Director of Nursing Amanda Organist, as follows:

• MOU is between the three (3) organizations listed above.

- MOU for five (5) Public Health Employees to be trained and certified to assist with Medicaid Enrollment process.
- Public Health will pay the application and background check fees then submit to CRH for reimbursement.

Commissioner Lienhoop made a motion to Enter into this Agreement as presented. Commissioner Kleinhenz seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

The next item was the Presentation of Bartholomew County Substance Abuse Comprehensive Community Plan, presented by Prevention Initiatives Director for Youth Services Center, Rachel Flohr-David, as follows:

- The Substance Abuse Council recommendations were approved by the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute for allocation from the Bartholomew County Local Drug Fee Communities Fund.
- The counter-measure fees related to alcohol and drug offenses collected totaled \$33,092.88
- The Council's proposal for disbursement is as follows:
