The Bartholomew County Council met on Tuesday, August 8, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Governmental Office Building, 440 Third Street, Columbus, Indiana.

President Jorge R. Morales called the meeting to order. Greg Patterson gave the invocation and President Morales led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The first item, under new business, was a request for additional appropriation from the Bartholomew County Library Fund in the amount of \$200,000 presented by Library Director Jason Hatton. As the planned projects have used all previously appropriated dollars, this appropriation will be used for the unanticipated elevator repair and will come from the Library's budget. Greg Patterson asked if the County could use ARP money to

help offset this expense. Chief Deputy Dalene Pattingill replied that this would be a question for the Commissioners. Director Hatton stated that he had, in fact, gone to Commissioner Tony London with this question but that he had said no, it was not possible at this time. With no further discussion, **Leah Beyer made a motion to approve the appropriation of \$200,000. Evelyn Strietelmeier Pence seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.**

The next item, also under new business, was a request by the Sheriff's Department for a Resolution allowing Commissary Monies to be used to pay for expenses as determined by the administration. Currently, there is just over \$500,000 in this fund.

Mark Gorbett made a motion to Approve the Resolution. Evelyn Strietelmeier-Pence seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

The next item was a Request for Additional Appropriation from the Adult Protective Services (8900-23) in the amount of \$9,000, presented by Director of Adult Protective Services Tonya Hardin and Prosecutor Lindsey Holden-Kay.
